This particular issue has all materials needed to participate in drama activities for the first semester. *If you have not been involved with the drama events in the past, please consider doing so. It is a lot of fun and reaps many rewards.*

At the July meeting of the Executive Board many actions were adopted that affect PHSSL's operation. Let me provide you with "headlines." You can find the details on the Action Pages in this mailing. Due to the number of changes made in the Bylaws, and the Radio Announcing Handbook, we are sending you an updated set of each. (Please remove/discard these entire sections and replace them with the enclosed ones). CAUTION: Do not discard any part of your Handbook unless you have received a replacement.

- 1. Ms. Lisa Bompiani-Smith, Mr. Bill Murray, Ms. Kathleen O'Halloran and Ms. Beth Young were re-elected to the Executive Board.
- 2. The Prep time for Lincoln Douglas Debate has been extended to four minutes.
- 3. The coin flip for sides and speaking order will be reinstituted in Public Forum.
- 4. A Quarterfinal round has been added to the Impromptu Speaking event held at the State Tournament.
- 5. Susquehanna University is pleased and able to offer Act 48 credits to public school teachers for participating in (1) PSDA Convention and (2) PHSSL State Tournament.
- 6. **Hall of Fame Coordinators:** Mr. David Long and Mr. Bill Murray. **Please send your nominations to one of these two gentlemen no later than December 1.**
- 7. There will be no Novice Debate in the State Tournament. However, points earned at the District Tournament level will be counted.
- 8. **AGAIN:** All Congress Bills/Resolutions are to be sent electronically as a word document to **Ms. Ursin** who will determine if they fit the format. (Email as a Microsoft Word Document to **ajursin@yahoo.com.**) **January 1** is the first day to submit, and **February 1** is the last day to submit Congress Bills/Resolutions to Ms. Ursin.
- 9. **REMINDER:** ALL Informative Speaking and Persuasive Speaking students MUST send (1) a copy of the speech, (2) a bibliography, and (3) a cover sheet signed by the student and the coach declaring this is an original speech BEFORE they compete in District or State Forensic competition.
- 10. No refund will be made for buffet tickets ordered two weeks prior to the State Tournament.
- 11. At the END of the State Tournament, YOU are responsible for attending the Awards Ceremony and having your student(s) pick up his/her own award(s). YOU or one of your students are also responsible to pick up your own results packets AFTER the Awards Ceremony. DO NOT ask another school to accept awards, or the results packet if you do not attend the Awards Ceremony.

As I said earlier, the above reflects "headlines." The minutes of the meeting detail the actions and discussions about the above. You will find a copy of the minutes in the September *Communicator*. PENNSYLVANIA HIGH SCHOOL SPEECH LEAGUE EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING – JULY 9, 2011

CALL TO ORDER:

The Executive Board of the Pennsylvania High School Speech League was called to order at 11:12 a.m., on Saturday, July 9, in Apfelbaum Hall, Room 217, at Susquehanna University with the following members present: Keith Brosious, John Buettler, Barbara Giuliano, Lorinda Krause, David Long, Bill Murray, Michael Nailor, Kate O'Halloran, Neil Strine, Beth Young, Larry Augustine, Executive Director, and Carolyn Trotta, Secretary. Absent from the meeting were Lisa Bompiani-Smith, Stacey Cawley, Hugh Ringer, and Alice Ursin. Mr. Augustine welcomed the returning members of the Executive Board: Lisa Bompiani-Smith, Bill Murray, Kate O'Halloran, and Beth Young, as well as new Executive Board Member and high school principal representative, Lorinda Krause, Selinsgrove High School.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Mr. Murray moved to approve the minutes. Mr. Buettler seconded the motion. The minutes were unanimously approved.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Several items were added to the prepared agenda.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mr. Augustine announced the tournament dates for the 2011 and 2012 Drama Festival (December 9 & 10, 2011) and State Tournament (March 23 & 24, 2012).

Mr. Augustine informed the board members that he is in the process of completing the IRS 990 form for the school year.

Mr. Augustine met with the new provost, Dr. Carl Moses, and felt that the meeting went well.

Mr. Augustine asked the board members to look at their handout regarding the member schools voting in 2011 Executive Board election.

Mr. Augustine announced that no funds were requested for Cross-Exam Debate training in the past school year. After much discussion, Mr. Murray made a motion to have a committee consisting of Mr. Murray, Mr. Nailor, and Ms. Young explore the option of using up to \$6500 of PHSSL funds to hold Cross-Exam Debate training for coaches in conjunction with the PSDA weekend conference. Mr. Long seconded the motion. Motion passed.

The Annual Financial Report for 2010-2011 was presented to the board. Mr. Nailor moved to accept the annual Financial Report. Ms. Young seconded the motion. Financial Report accepted.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

None

OLD BUSINESS:

Mr. Nailor addressed the rule of Speaker Awards in Policy Debate. After much discussion, Mr. Nailor made a motion to eliminate Cross-Exam Debate Speaker Awards, (B20.5). Ms. O'Halloran seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously. Bylaws will be updated.

Mr. Buettler reviewed the changes made to Radio Announcing at the State Tournament. All board members agreed that feedback received from coaches was positive. Discussion was had concerning the students preparing three speeches but many only able to read one due to the format of the rounds. The current event format is Round 1 – Student prepared script; Round 2 – Sight reading; Quarterfinal Round – Student prepared script; Semifinal Round - Student prepared script; Final Round – Sight reading with edits. After some discussion, Mr. Buettler made a motion to change the event format to: Round 1 – Student prepared script (International News); Round 2 – Student prepared script (Lighter Side); Quarterfinal Round – Student prepared script (National News); Semifinal Round – Sight Reading;

Final Round – Sight reading with edits.

Ms. Young seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously. Procedures will be updated.

Later in the meeting, Mr. Buettler requested to amend the motion to:

Round 1 – Student prepared script (International News); Round 2 – Student prepared script (Lighter Side); Quarterfinal Round – Sight reading; Semifinal Round – Student Prepared script (National News); Final Round – Sight reading with edits.

Ms. Giuliano seconded the motion. Amended motion failed 5-4.

Mr. Nailor addressed the issue of using online tabulation versus manual tabulation during the State Tournament. Mr. Long stated he used both manual and Excel worksheets to tabulate state tournament results in the last tournament, and the

online tabulation was more efficient, and easier for results posting in The Communicator. Discussion continued that results sheets can be posted on the PHSSL website to save printing costs. The online results would not be posted until after the completion of the tournament. Online tabulation would also reduce the number of people needed in the tab room. Mr. Nailor made a motion to move from manual to online tabulation at the State Tournament and to reduce the number of people in the tab room. Mr. Nailor and Mr. Long will work together to reexamine the tab room staffing needs. Ms. Young seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Augustine asked the board to address proposals by Brad Taylor and Lawrence Husick requesting adjustments to the entry and qualification numbers due to the large number of schools in district 10. After much discussion concerning the impact these changes would make across the state, Mr. Nailor made a motion to invite district 10 to split evenly into two based upon the 24 participant schools of 2010-2011, into District 10 and District 15. If they choose to stay as one large district, there will be no rule changes to accommodate their larger size. They should have their recommendation in writing to Mr. Augustine by October 1, 2011. Ms. Giuliano seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS:

Administrative

Mr. Augustine asked all Executive Board members to review the following handouts for the 2011-2012 school year:

- 1. The brochure to be sent to non-member schools. Mr. Buettler rewrote the Radio Announcing summary which will be updated.
- 2. The 2011-2012 calendar. Mr. Long made the motion to adopt the calendar. Ms. O'Halloran seconded the motion. Calendar adopted.
- 3. District Board Assignments were kept the same as last year.
- 4. Regional Drama Festival Chair assignments for 2011-2012 were discussed. Carl Askew stepped down in the Eastern Region. Request made to ask Ms. Sarah Scranta from Abington Heights High School.
- 5. Mr. Long and Mr. Murray willingly accepted the duties of Hall of Fame Coordinators. The September *Communicator* will have a Hall of Fame nomination form enclosed and all persons interested in nominating someone for the Hall of Fame will need to complete the form and send it to Mr. Long or Mr. Murray by **December 1**. Rules and regulations for nominating someone to the Hall of Fame are in the Bylaws.

Debate

- 1. Mr. Murray recalled a situation at the state tournament where a debate judge in a later round stated to competitors that she "did not know a thing about debate." After much discussion, it was determined that there will be a page added to the Joy of Tournaments website where information about and the experience of the judge must be listed. This form will be for judges for all state events. If a problem arises with a judge at the tournament, Mr. Nailor will address the issue with the coach of the team who appointed said judge.
- 2. Mr. Brosious stated that both CFL and NFL Lincoln Douglas debate events have 4 minutes of prep time where PHSSL currently has 3 minutes. Mr. Brosious moved to extend the prep time for Lincoln Douglas Debate to 4 minutes. Ms. Young seconded the motion. Motion passed. ByLaws and ballots will be updated.
- 3. Mr. Brosious noted that a number of coaches were unhappy with the latest rule change in Public Forum. Mr. Brosious moved to bring back the coin flip for sides and speaker order. Ms. O'Halloran seconded the motion. Motion passed. Ballots and Bylaws will be updated.
- 4. Mr. Augustine asked the Executive Board to read an email from Mr. Lawrence A. Husick proposing a two person Parliamentary Debate team modeled after the APDA, American Parliamentary Debate Association, as opposed to our three person team format which was modeled after the World Schools Debate. After a discussion, no action was taken.

Individual Events

- 1. Mr. Long questioned the Informative Speaking time limit of 7 minutes when Persuasive Speaking is 10 minutes. Mr. Long moved to extend Informative Speaking from 7 minutes to 10 minutes. Mr. Strine seconded the motion. Motion defeated.
- 2. Mr. Long proposed adding a qualifying event to Congress. This is in addition to the current Congress, which will remain unchanged. After much discussion, Mr. Long made a motion to create a qualifying congress called the "Senate." This event will have qualification competition at the district tournaments to compete at the State Tournament. This event, being adopted now, will be implemented during the 2012-2013 school year. Mr. Long will create a proposal to distribute

to the executive board at the March 2012 meeting, to then be discussed in depth at the summer 2012 meeting. The motion was seconded by Ms. Young. Motion passed.

- 3. Ms. O'Halloran suggested adding a quarterfinal round to Impromptu Speaking. Motion made by Ms. O'Halloran. Mr. Brosious seconded. Motion passed. Bylaws will be updated.
- 4. Ms. O'Halloran made the motion for all quarterfinalists in Radio Announcing and Impromptu Speaking to receive certificates. Mr. Buettler seconded. Motion passed. Bylaws will be updated.
- 5. Mr. Buettler questioned sweepstakes points for quarterfinalists in Radio Announcing and Impromptu Speaking. Mr. Long made a motion for a committee to revisit the sweepstakes points received for all events at the state tournament. The committee will consist of Mr. Strine, Ms. Krause and Mr. Jerry Colapinto. Mr. Nailor will be available to give them any background information they will need. Motion seconded by Ms. O'Halloran. Motion passed.
- 6. Dr. Giuliano questioned the qualifications of individual judges at the state level. After much discussion, it was decided that coaches will need to make Mr. Nailor aware of any IE judge they bring to the tournament that may not be qualified to judge later rounds.

District Tournaments

- 1. Mr. Augustine questioned if the correct number of certificates were being handed out at the district tournaments. Mr. Nailor confirmed the Bylaws state that all first place winners receive pins and all State Qualifiers receive certificates.
- 2. Mr. Murray questioned if a student can connect to the internet using a device that connects through its own phone service, when the rest of the school may not have that access. After much discussion, Mr. Murray made a motion to change D.25 and S.23 to read:
 - There is NO GUARANTEE of power or of Internet connectivity and there should be no expectation placed on host schools to provide either of these resources. Students wishing to use laptops or other digital devices **that connect to the internet** will have to be responsible for providing these resources and for having an alternative plan if the digital devices fail.
- Ms. Young seconded the motion. Motion Passed.
- 3. Ms. Ursin requested more space on the District Qualifying Form under Policy Debate to list a second team. The form will be updated.
- 4. Dr. Giuliano requested the board read an email from Brad Taylor regarding byes and forfeits. After some discussion, it was decided that the current rules address these situations. No action was taken.
- 5. The board discussed an email from Lawrence Husick concerning Hybrid teams in Policy Debate. The PHSSL rules state that hybrid teams are not allowed at the District and State Tournaments. Hybrid teams are allowed in invitational tournaments. No action was taken.
- 6. An email from Mr. Lawrence Husick requested that the board require that students participate in at least 2 "PHSSL sponsored events" prior to and in order to qualify to compete at the District Tournament. This was discussed. The only "PHSSL sponsored" events are the District and State Tournaments. No action was taken.

State Tournament

- 1. Mr. Augustine questioned whether Public Forum Debate was considered a speech or debate event in relation to judging requirements. Mr. Nailor confirmed that for judging purposes, it is considered a speech event and so a speech judge can be hired for that event.
- 2. Ms. Cawley questioned the posting of semifinalists and finalists outside of Apfelbaum Hall at the State Tournament. After some discussion, it was decided that the postings outside will continue, but the semifinalist and finalist competitors and judges will also be posted on the PHSSL website.
- 3. Mr. Nailor reported that several teams at the State Tournament this year committed "video plagiarism" by using the exact same cutting and blocking as in a YouTube video. After some discussion, Ms. Young moved to add a statement to

- D.17 and S.10 concerning internet plagiarism and that penalties will be at the judge's discretion. Mr. Nailor will craft the statement. Seconded by Mr. Strine. Motion passed.
- 4. Mr. Augustine called to the attention of the board a proposal by Mr. Jerry Colapinto suggesting that the winner of any PHSSL event at the State Tournament should auto-qualify for the next year. After some discussion, no action was taken.

Mr. Augustine received an email from Robert Dunham questioning what was being done for the PHSSL's 50th anniversary. The question was raised, when exactly is the 50th anniversary? After much discussion and examining of the PHSSL newsletters in the archives, it was found that prior to 1959 there was the Pennsylvania Forensic and Music League. In September of 1959, The PA Forensic League was started and continued through the 1959-1960 and 1960-1961 school years. September of 1961 was the beginning of the Pennsylvania High School Speech League.

The next PHSSL Executive Board meeting will be held on Thursday, March 22, 2012. With no further business, the PHSSL Executive Board Meeting adjourned at 3:45 PM.

Article B17 – Drama

Section B17.1

Each school may have one entry in the Regional Drama Festivals. In the case of a single gender school, arrangements may be made with the Chairperson of the event.

Section B17.2

Each region shall qualify two plays to the State Drama Festival. If eight schools participate in any Regional Drama Festival, three plays will advance from that Regional Festival to the State Drama Festival. No more than eight in a region. If more than 24 schools enter the Regional Festival, a fourth Regional Festival will be created.

Section B17.3

Material used may be a one-act play, a cutting from a longer play, or an original play. Musicals may not be used. The play must have a minimum of three characters. Characters may not be added or cut from published plays that would be in violation of copyright regulations except with written permission by the publisher and/or author. The play which wins first place in the State Tournament may not be used the following year. Each school is responsible for any royalty obligations.

Section B17.4

The playing time shall be not less than 20 minutes nor more than 40 minutes. Each play shall also have up to 10 minutes for setting the stage and up to 5 minutes for striking the stage.

Section B17.5

A total of 40 minutes will be available to each play for technical rehearsal, including setting the stage, and striking the stage. The time may be used at the discretion of each school but may not exceed 40 minutes total.

Section B17.6

The host school shall supply a basic lighting plot with a minimum of three general lighting areas and one follow spot. It is suggested that participating schools supply a light, sound, and curtain cue sheet. The host school shall supply a simple set adaptable to the needs of the plays. No school should attempt to transport to the festival complete stage settings. All hand properties, make-up, and costumes shall be provided by the school presenting the play.

Section B17.7

Any play that is more than one minute under the minimum or one minute over the maximum in extra playing or technical time is not eligible to receive first place on any individual judge's ballot. This will not affect the selection to the All-State Cast.

Section B17.8

- a. The regional and state judging shall be the ranking system as used in all Pennsylvania High School Speech League events.
- b. In addition to the ranking of the plays at the State Drama Festival, the judges will name an All-State Cast of not less than three or more than ten members.
- c. The judges are to be selected by the Regional Coordinators for regional competition, and by the Executive Director for State competition. A panel of three judges must be used at the Regional competition. Regional judges will be paid \$10.00 per play. A panel of five judges must be used at the State competition.

Section B17.9

The Director of the contest play will not be allowed backstage during setup, performance, and strike.

Section B17.10

Awards at the State Festival: the top three schools receive plaques (first, second, and third); the remaining schools receive "State Finalist" plaques. Each student selected as a member of the All-State Cast receives a plaque (no fewer than three or more than eight to be selected).

Section B17.11

Regional Registration will now be sent to the State Office and after all registrations are received, individual schools will be assigned to a regional competition. Geographic location and equalization of regional competition will be the prime factors in assigning schools. There will be three regions. No more than eight schools can be assigned to a region. If needed, additional region(s) will be created. The registration fee for the regional drama festival shall not exceed \$50.00.

Section B17.12

The Drama Handbook shall be considered a part of the Constitution.

FESTIVAL AND CONTEST SUGGESTIONS

The Regional Drama Coordinator will schedule its Drama Festival whenever it is convenient for that particular Region, and at any time prior to the deadline set by the League Office. Each member school is permitted to enter a play in a Regional Festival. Each Region shall qualify two plays to the State Festival. Where possible, area colleges might be willing to help with the Regional Festival in providing facilities and judges. A member of the Executive Board will be appointed as liaison to each of the Regional Drama Festivals.

The following suggestions are given for the Regional Coordinator and host schools in planning for the Regional, and State Festival.

- 1. The Regional Drama Coordinator must be active in secondary school drama and/or knowledgeable in drama.
- 2. All deadline dates for the Regional and State Festivals will be enforced.
- 3. The schedule for the performances of the plays can be by an impartial drawing for position; or the plays may be scheduled to facilitate staging and timing by the Regional Coordinator (Regional) and the Executive Director (State).
- 4. The host school or Coordinator will provide a competent stage crew. The participating school may provide its own trained stage crew, if acceptable with host and the school's regulations.
- 5. The host school shall provide competent light and sound technicians who will receive cues from the competing high school student stage managers.
- 6. The host shall provide a timekeeper and such house personnel as necessary to insure a smooth running performance.
- 7. The Coordinator will be responsible for sending all necessary information and reports to the Executive Director immediately at the close of the event.

It is the responsibility of the Coordinator in charge to secure competent judges. The judging will be by a panel of judges. Regional judges will be paid \$10.00 per play. The following committees can function to arrange for the planning and presentations of Drama events:

Regional Festival: Director of the host school, Regional Coordinator as appointed by the Executive

Director, and Chairperson of the participating districts

State Festival: Executive Director, Executive Committee, and the Regional Directors

NOTE: PHSSL Membership Form MUST be completed and dues paid prior to Drama Festival.



| Since s the play not be | ing, directing and technical aspects of the production should all be considered as a whole in the critic's evaluation. chools are required to keep the amount of scenery to a minimum, the critic is to evaluate the technical aspects of a in terms of the performer's adaptation to and use of stage, lighting, and furniture available. Choice of play should a criterion in your ranking; rather, the critic should evaluate how well the play chosen was presented. Critics are arily allowed some leeway in appraising the performances. We wish the following factors considered as basic, er: |
| 1. | <u>CHARACTERIZATION AND INTERPRETATION</u> - Was there a complete bodily and mental re-creation of the characters by the actors? Were their reactions to other actors correct and effective? Were the interpretations of the roles believable? Was there sufficient motivation, action, and reaction? |
| 2. | <u>VOICE AND DICTION</u> - Could you hear the actors distinctly? Was there variety of rate and inflection? Was pronunciation and articulation properly done and in keeping with the play? |
| 3. | PLOT DEVELOPMENT - Was the production unified? If a cutting, was it a complete and understandable unit? Did the ensemble carry the situation to a suitable climax? Did the characterizations and action advance the plot? |
| 4. | <u>DIRECTION</u> - Were the roles appropriately cast? Was the theme or main idea of the play brought out? Was there evidence of effectiveness of the director's influence over mechanics of stage business, balance, proportion, emphasis, placing, grouping, and movement of the players on stage and in creation of mood? Were the time limits observed? |
| 5. | <u>TEMPO</u> - Was the pace in keeping with the general idea of the play? Was there smoothness, variety, and appropriateness in the movement of the play? |
| 6. | <u>MAKE-UP AND COSTUMES</u> - Although no extra credit should be allowed for unusual or elaborate costuming or make-up, were these reasonably convincing and appropriate for the creation of the illusion? |
| 7. | TOTAL EFFECTIVENESS - What was the total impression of the production upon you, the critic? |
