Dear High School Forensics Colleague -

I am excited to announce that Bloomsburg University is the new permanent home of the Pennsylvania High School Speech League (PHSSL). The PHSSL Executive Board unanimously selected me to succeed Professor Larry Augustine as the Executive Director at the April, 2016 Executive Board Meeting and accepted Bloomsburg University's offer to host the organization. As you may know, Larry officially retired from Susquehanna University at the end of May, after serving as the Executive Director of PHSSL since 1992. Jodi is the secretary for the Art and Art History Department here at BU and has graciously offered her services to PHSSL. Jodi has already been a tremendous help to me in organizing and planning the PHSSL Summer Meeting, publishing *The Communicator*, answering emails, and just doing everything to get PHSSL settled at BU. I am excited to have Jodi on board with us.

The PHSSL Executive Board met at Bloomsburg University for the first time on July 14, 2016 for the Summer Executive Board Meeting. During the meeting Professor Ethan Krupp, Director of the Division of Theater, provided a guided tour of the Haas Center for the Arts, the new location for the State Drama Festival on campus. Also, Bloomsburg University's acting Vice-Provost and Dean of Undergraduate Studies, Dr. George Agbango, and the Dean of the College of Liberal Arts, Dr. James Brown personally welcomed PHSSL to Bloomsburg University. Bloomsburg University is very excited to be the new home to PHSSL. By way of a brief introduction . . . I am currently the Chair of the Political Science Department and the Director of Forensics at Bloomsburg University. As the Director of Forensics, I coach students in speech and debate and accompany our speech and debate team to approximately 3-4 tournaments per semester. We primarily compete in the Collegiate Forensic Association which has an educational focus for forensics and is geared toward colleges and universities with smaller budgets. We have a core of about 6-8 students on our team. BU students may choose to earn credits toward graduation for participating in forensics tournaments.

I competed in forensics (PA High School Speech League) for 4 years at Bloomsburg Area High School and in 1988, my junior year, I was a quarter-finalist in Lincoln-Douglas Debate at the PHSSL state tournament at Penn State University. I also competed in forensics for 4 years as an undergraduate at Bloomsburg University and, after graduation from BU in 1993, I served as the graduate assistant/coach for the BU Forensics Team for one semester in the Communication Studies MA Program. I later earned my MA in American Politics/Political Science from Ohio University in November, 1994 and then completed my Ph.D. in Political Science/American Politics at Purdue University in December, 2004. I have been a political science professor at Bloomsburg University since January, 2003 and the Director of Forensics since 2005. I have also served as the Higher Education Representative on the PHSSL executive board for several years.

My wife and I met each other as undergraduate members of the BU Forensics Team in 1992 and we were married in 1998. My wife also competed in forensics for 4 years at Waynesboro High School. We have two daughters who will soon be 9 and 6 years old. It is safe to say that forensics is and has been a very important part of our lives. I will be serving as the Executive Director of PHSSL as part of my service to Bloomsburg University and because I want the next generation of high school students to benefit from this wonderful academic experience.

I look forward to serving as the new Executive Director of PHSSL!

Pennsylvania High School Speech League & Drama Festival Bloomsburg University - Event Background Clearances

Requirements

The amended <u>Child Protective Services Law</u>, effective December 31, 2014, and accompanying policies; PASSHE Board of Governors <u>2014-01-A</u> (Protection of Minors) and Bloomsburg University's <u>PRP 2410</u> (Background Screening, Protection of Minors and Volunteerism) requires all prospective employees or volunteers for camps, conferences, and programs held at Bloomsburg University to complete a series of background clearances.

Specifically, all program employees or volunteers are required to successfully complete –OR– certify compliance with the Pennsylvania Child Abuse History Clearance, Pennsylvania State Police Criminal Record Check, and FBI Federal Criminal History Record. Completion or compliance certification is dependent upon the role and sponsorship of the Authorized Adult as follows:

- Individuals who are compensated by or are official volunteers for Bloomsburg University will complete required screenings using the Bloomsburg University process.
- Individuals who are NOT employed by or an official Bloomsburg University volunteer must certify compliance with required clearances. Most Authorized Adults participating in the PHSSL and Drama Festival will fall into this category.

Additionally, all Authorized Adults are considered Mandatory Reporters of Child Abuse per <u>PRP 2412</u> and must abide by Bloomsburg University's Code of Conduct.

All documentation must be submitted thirty (30) days prior to the event start date per Bloomsburg University's <u>policy</u>. However, we have set a compliance deadline of <u>January 15, 2017</u> for this event. Each school will have a designated contact person who will be responsible for distributing, collecting, and submitted required documentation to the Bloomsburg University Program Administrator's designee, <u>Ms.</u> Jodi Fetterolf. Pennsylvania High School Speech League Summer Executive Board Meeting July 14, 2016

CALL TO ORDER:

The Executive Board of the Pennsylvania High School Speech League was called to order at 12:45 p.m., on Thursday, July 14, in Kehr Union, Multicultural Center 230, at Bloomsburg University with the following members present: Lisa Bompiani-Smith, Ellen Boyer, Keith Brosious, David Long, Kathleen O'Halloran, Hugh Ringer, Beth Young, Christine Metcalfe, Barb Giuliano, Nathan Lawver, Jerry Colapinto, Phil Burrell, Larry Augustine, Neil Strine, Executive Director, and Codie Nevil Sauers & Jodi Fetterolf, Secretary. Mr. Strine welcomed the returning members of the Executive Board: Barbara Giuliano & Dave Long, as well as new Executive Board Members Jerry Colapinto and Phil Burrell.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Neil Strine asked the board to review the minutes from the April Executive Board Meeting. Christine Metcalfe made a *motion to approve the March Executive Board minutes*. Beth Young seconded the motion. The minutes were unanimously approved.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Neil Strine mentioned that there would be some agenda changes. They would discuss District items first and then state items.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Neil Strine announced the tournament dates for the 2017: Drama Festival (January 6 & 7, 2017) and State Tournament (March 17 & 18, 2017). Also, announced were the tournament dates for 2018: Drama Festival (January 5 & 6, 2018) and State Tournament (March 16 & 17, 2018).

Larry Augustine and Neil Strine informed the board members that they are in the process of completing the IRS 990 form for the school year. They will meet with the accountant and then decide if they will be using the same person for next year due to the move from Susquehanna to Bloomsburg University.

Neil Strine asked the board members to look at their handout regarding the member schools voting in 2016 Executive Board election. He briefly reviewed the addition of reporting numbers and percentages for the previous and current years. Nathan stated that his district did vote but it appears to not have been counted. Codie was looking into it. Christine asked how ballots are sent. It was stated that ballots are emailed in. The low vote count could be due to it being done later in the summer. It was asked that a possible Good Form be used for future ballots and that they are sent out during the school year when everyone is still in session.

Larry Augustine reviewed the Balance Sheet, Profit and Loss report and Detail report, Account Quick Report, Workbook Transactions, and newly created Income Summary. He reported that it was a good year profit wise with no major expenses. Major expenses like pins will be purchased this year. There was approximately \$70,000 in the bank when turned over to Neil Strine. The donation from former Speech and Debate coach Judy Kissel was \$1,835. There is no specific designation for the donation. A letter of thanks was sent by Larry. New Quickbooks was purchased for use on Neil's computer at Bloomsburg University. Historical date will also be backed up from Larry's.

David Long made a *motion to accept the 2015-2016 Financial Report*. The motion was seconded by Beth Young and the motion was unanimously approved.

Administrative

1. Mr. Augustine asked all Executive Board members to review the following handouts and information for the 2016-2017 school year: (information found on handouts are bolded)

- Minor corrections were reviewed regarding the **PHSSL brochure**, updates and additions will be given to Jodi. The brochure will be sent to both previous and non-member schools within the Commonwealth along with an invitation to join PHSSL during the 2016-2017 school year.
- The **2016-2017 calendar** was reviewed. Additions will be added on, and it will be posted on the website and each *Communicator* edition that is published. District tournaments must be held by Feb 25 (special circumstances will be considered) District Reports by March 1.
- **District Board assignments** were kept the same as last year, with the exception of the addition of Jerry Colapinto being assigned to District 11 and Phil Burrell being assigned to District 4.
- **Regional Drama Festival Chair assignments** for 2013-2014 were discussed. All coordinators remain the same.
- Mr. Long will continue the duties of Hall of Fame Coordinators. The September *Communicator* will have a Hall of Fame nomination form enclosed and all persons interested in nominating someone for the Hall of Fame will need to complete the form and send it to Mr. Long by December 1. Rules and regulations for nominating someone to the Hall of Fame are in the Bylaws. A reminder that people do not roll over. It is a clean slate for new nominations.

District General Business

- 1. Congress House Rules/Handbook Updates
 - a. Mike Schaffer did not send and the issue was tabled until received.
- 2. Senate Bills were discussed. They need to be received two weeks before the Tournament.
- 3. District Rules (pg33) Adding Senate to Sweepstakes. Add Senate to the information about split tournament on Page 24. Motion to amend was made by Beth Young. The motion was seconded by Nathan Lawver. The motion was unanimously approved.
 - a. District Standing Rules Section D 18 under Plan C.
 - i. Add a line at the end of the paragraph The district chair will provide 3 pieces of neutral legislation for supersession.
- 4. Plan to qualify additional students to states. A handout was given by Beth Young. A discussion was held. Forensics at the state level should be available to more students. Base is on individual performances at each event and on district performance and participation. Allow for a reward system. The topic was tabled until the summer 2017 board meeting.

HR Representative Presentation – Background Checks

Representatives from the Human Resources Department, Ellen Sudbury & Kristina Wood, came to speak to the board members about the background check requirements. The discussed the protection of minors on campus and the state requirements for Adults. They referred to BU Policies PRP 2410 and PRP 2412 found on the BU website. The background checks required are the PSP State Police Check, FBI Finger Print Check, and The PA Child Abuse Check. Two forms need to be filled out included the Authorized Adult and Certification of Compliance form. These checks need to be complete 30 days prior to events. Discussion was held. Volunteers can do the PSP and Child Abuse Clearances for Free and the FBI Check is exempt if you have lived in PA for ten years. If anyone has questions they can be directed to the following:



Section B18.1

Each school may have one entry in the Regional Drama Festivals. In the case of a single gender school, arrangements may be made with the Regional Drama Coordinator of the event.

Section B18.2

Each region shall qualify two plays to the State Drama Festival. If eight schools participate in any Regional Drama Festival, three plays will advance from that Regional Festival to the State Drama Festival. No more than eight schools shall make up a Regional Festival. If more than 24 schools enter the Regional Festival, a fourth Regional Festival will be created.

Section B18.3

Material used may be a one-act play, a cutting from a longer play, or an original play. Musicals may not be used. The play must have a minimum of three characters. Characters may not be added or cut from published plays that would be in violation of copyright regulations except with written permission by the publisher and/or author. The play which wins first place in the State Tournament may not be used the following year. Each school is responsible for any royalty obligations.

Section B18.4

The playing time shall be not less than 20 minutes nor more than 40 minutes. Each play shall also have up to 10 minutes for setting the stage and up to 5 minutes for striking the stage.

Section B18.5

A total of 40 minutes will be available to each play for technical rehearsal, including setting the stage, and striking the stage. The time may be used at the discretion of each school, but may not exceed 40 minutes total.

Section B18.6

The host school shall supply a basic lighting plot with a minimum of three general lighting areas and one follow spot. It is suggested that participating schools supply a light, sound, and curtain cue sheet. The host school shall supply a simple set adaptable to the needs of the plays. No school should attempt to transport to the festival complete stage settings. All hand properties, make-up, and costumes shall be provided by the school presenting the play.

Section B18.7

Any play that is more than one minute under the minimum or one minute over the maximum in extra playing or technical time is not eligible to receive first place on any individual judge's ballot. This will not affect the selection to the All-State Cast.

Section B18.8

- a. The regional and state judging shall be the ranking system as used in all Pennsylvania High School Speech League events.
- b. In addition to the ranking of the plays at the State Drama Festival, the judges will name an All-State Cast of not less than three or more than ten members.
- c. The judges are to be selected by the Regional Coordinators for regional competition, and by the Executive Director for State competition. A panel of three judges must be used at the Regional competition. Regional judges will be paid \$10.00 per play. A panel of five judges must be used at the State competition.

Section B18.9

The Director of the contest play will not be allowed backstage during setup, performance, and strike. The Director is permitted in the dressing rooms.

Section B18.10

Awards at the State Festival: the top three schools receive plaques (first, second, and third); the remaining schools receive "State Finalist" plaques. Each student selected as a member of the All-State Cast receives a plaque (no fewer than three or more than eight).

Section B18.11

Regional Registration will now be sent to the State Office, and after all registrations are received, individual schools will be assigned to a regional competition. Geographic location and equalization of regional competition will be the prime factors in assigning schools. There will be three regions. No more than eight schools can be assigned to a region. If needed, additional region(s) will be created. The registration fee for the regional drama festival shall not exceed \$50.00.

Section B18.12

All schools participating in Regional Drama will receive 4 points for participation. All schools participating in State Drama will receive 4 points for participation.

Section B18.13

The Drama Handbook shall be considered a part of the Constitution.

FESTIVAL AND CONTEST SUGGESTIONS

The Regional Drama Coordinator will schedule its Drama Festival whenever it is convenient for that particular Region, and at any time prior to the deadline set by the League Office. Each member school is permitted to enter a play in a Regional Festival. Each Region shall qualify two plays to the State Festival. Where possible, area colleges might be willing to help with the Regional Festival in providing facilities and judges. A member of the Executive Board will be appointed as liaison to each of the Regional Drama Festivals.

The following suggestions are given for the Regional Coordinator and host schools in planning for the Regional, and State Festival.

- 1. The Regional Drama Coordinator must be active in secondary school drama and/or knowledgeable in drama.
- 2. All deadline dates for the Regional and State Festivals will be enforced.
- 3. The schedule for the performances of the plays can be by an impartial drawing for position; or the plays may be scheduled to facilitate staging and timing by the Regional Coordinator (Regional) and the Executive Director (State).
- 4. The host school or Coordinator will provide a competent stage crew. The participating school may provide its own trained stage crew, if acceptable with host and the school's regulations.
- 5. The host school shall provide competent light and sound technicians who will receive cues from the competing high school student stage managers.
- 6. The host shall provide a timekeeper and such house personnel as necessary to insure a smooth running performance.
- 7. The Coordinator will be responsible for sending all necessary information and reports to the Executive Director immediately at the close of the event.

It is the responsibility of the Coordinator in charge to secure competent judges. The judging will be by a panel of judges. Regional judges will be paid \$10.00 per play. The following committees can function to arrange for the planning and presentations of Drama events:

<u>Regional Festival</u>: Director of the host school, Regional Coordinator as appointed by the Executive Director, and Chairperson of the participating districts

<u>State Festival</u>: Executive Director, Executive Committee, and the Regional Directors

NOTE: PHSSL Membership Form MUST be completed and dues paid prior to Drama Festival.

The acting, directing and technical aspects of production should all be considered as a whole in the critic's evaluation. Since schools are required to keep the amount of scenery to a minimum, the critic is to evaluate the technical aspects of the play in terms of performer's adaption to and use of stage, lighting, and furniture available. Choice of play should not be a criterion in your ranking; rather, the critic should evaluate how well the play chosen was presented. Critics are necessarily allowed some leeway in appraising the performances. We wish the following factors considered as basic, however:

- 1. Characterization and Interpretation Was there a complete bodily and mental recreation of characters by the actors? Were their reactions to other actors correct and effective? Were the interpretations of the roles believable? Was there sufficient motivation, action, and reaction?
- 2. Voice and Diction Could you hear the actors distinctly? Was there variety of rate and inflection? Was pronunciation and articulation properly done and in keeping with the play?
- 3. <u>Plot Development</u> Was the production unified? If a cutting, was it a complete and understandable unit? Did ensemble carry the situation to a suitable climax? Did the characterizations and action advance the plot?
- 4. **Direction** Were the roles appropriately cast? Was the theme or main idea of the play brought out? Was there evidence of effectiveness of the director's influence over mechanics of stage business, balance, proportion, emphasis, placing, grouping, and movement of the players on stage and in creation of mood? Were the time limits observed?
- 5. **Tempo** Was the pace in keeping with the general idea of the play? Was there smoothness, variety, and appropriateness in the movement of the play?
- 6. Make-Up and Costumes Although no extra credit should allowed for unusual or elaborate costuming or make-up, were these reasonably convincing and appropriate for the creation of the illusion?
- 7. Total Effectiveness What was the total impression of the production upon you, the critic?
- 8. **Critique** Please continue your comments on the back.
