	Items to consider for coaches
	With the exception of the Drama festivals, for which judges are arranged by the league, schools are expected to bring judges
	to cover their entries. Usually it is 1 judge for every 2 entries in a particular debate event; Policy, Lincoln-Douglas,
	Parliamentary and Public Forum. Public Forum judges are considered part of the speech judge pool as well. It is usually 1
	judge for every four or five Congress, Speech, and Interpretation entries. Be sure to follow the directions on the invitation.
Judges	At the state tournament, the Congress/Speech/Interp quota is 1:3
	The state tournament allows for the hiring of one judge by a school as long as that school is providing a judge already. Check
	with your district chair for the possibility of hiring judges for the district tournament.
	Judges are to be high school graduates who have been trained for the events for which they will judge. For Congress, speech
	and interp judges, they should expect to judge ANY of these events not just specific ones. By the time of the district
	tournament and state tournament, it is expected that judges have been trained and judged during the year. First time judge
	should be avoided at districts and states.
	HS graduates in their first year after graduation may be used per district committee approval at the district tournament.
	Check with your district chair. These judges may be used at states provided another judge is supplied by the school and not
	hired. HS graduates in their first year after graduation will only be used for preliminary rounds at the state tournament. Be sure to indicate if any of your judges are in this category when you register for the district and/or state tournament.

	Copies of these speeches are required before the start of the district or state tournament. It is recommended that they be

	Policy Debate - Released May of the previous school year. Resolution is used all year.
	Lincoln-Douglas Debate - Used for two months starting with Sept/Oct. Released the 1st of the month before the resolution is
	used. Since the state tournament will use the March/April topic, that is released February 1
	Public Forum Debate - Changes Monthly. Released the first of the month before it is used. The March topic is released
	February 1
	Parliamentary Debate - This is the only debate event whose topic does NOT come from the NSDA. This event uses a Prepared
	Motion and Topic areas for Impromptu rounds. The Prepared Motion is on the PHSSL Website in the Fall Communicator.
	Parliamentary Extemporaneous Topics will be released March 1

	limit of 125 and 150, respectively, words of direct quotation in the speech. Extemporaneous Speaking and Commentary
